THE FIELD SEMESTER

A semester immersed in sustainable living and learning on the land

FACT SHEET

PROGRAM:

The Field Semester blends intellectual study and experiential learning. Through rigorous coursework, daily responsibilities, and active environmental stewardship students will develop a deep understanding of their role in the world and their responsibility to protect the planet.

- An academic and immersive residential program focused on environmental stewardship, community, and place
- Initially 15 students scaling up over time to a maximum of 45
- Self-selecting, motivated 11th and 12th graders from public, charter, and private schools
- We are committed to making this program accessible to all families; 30% of revenue used for scholarships
- 16-week semesters; each with weekend trips and a one week break

SUPERVISION:

The power of this program comes from fully immersing students in the experience of living and learning together on the land. Guided by expert faculty, students' days will be filled from dawn to dusk with a rigorous schedule of coursework, field exploration, chores, group activities, self-reflection, and studying.

- 24/7 accountability for every student
- Students must sign out if ever stepping off campus
- 1:9 adult to student ratio over night
- 1:5 adult to student ratio during the day
- No student cars

POSITIVE COMMUNITY IMPACT:

Partnering with TFS could significantly bolster PCCS's efforts to restore the schoolhouse and serve as a social hub for Port Costa.

- Ensure funding for completion of Schoolhouse restoration and upgrades
- TFS will host events that community members are encouraged to join such as classes, dinners, work parties, guest lectures, film screenings, and more
- Extra hands for town projects such as parking lot clean-up, town sidewalk and drain maintenance, beach clean-up, and trail maintenance

- An increased responsible presence on the land should deter illegal activities such as dumping and loitering
- As a partnership we will be more attractive to funders than as individual organizations
- Improvement and maintenance of recreational spaces on reservoir, schoolyard, and hillside lands, such as pathways and picnic areas
- · Reinforce current community gardening and town beautification efforts
- Offer a produce supply for the community
- Educate a new generation of leaders who will carry on the values of Port Costa and become advocates for the town and similar communities
- Guaranteed spots for Port Costa children

WHO WE ARE:

The three founders—Yaeir Heber, Andy Spear, and Paul Scott—have more than fifty years of combined experience in education. They have developed high school course curricula, traveled the world studying sustainable communities, managed classrooms and administrative teams, run summer programs, and won awards for teaching excellence. They have assembled a team of seasoned experts from a wide range of fields, including boarding school operations, finance and venture capital, nonprofit management, and environmental law, to develop this project.

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
